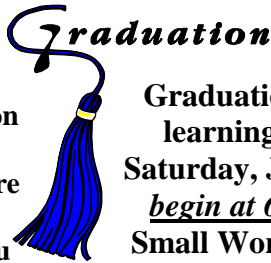


# Small World Wee Bits

## **Stricter Immunization Child Care Regulations**

The Office of Child Development and Early Learning is becoming more strict with their requirements on childcare centers and the monitoring of immunizations. Previously I was required to make sure that a well visit paper was filled out, now I will be required to make sure that the immunizations are done according to the Center of Disease Control and that the children all have the appropriate vaccinations for their age. I will be checking each child's immunization history and keeping a chart for each child to monitor their individual immunization schedule. Please be sure to get documentation for all shots for me. You will be required to go back to the doctor for documentation if you forget.

Is your child wearing safe shoes to be climbing and running on the playground? We limit climbing activities and ball field play when children are wearing sandals. Open toes, flip flops, smooth bottoms Crocs and buckles are things that we look for when limiting activity. Safety is more important than fashion during playtime; can your child play safely in the shoes they have chosen?!
